About this Training

Motivational Interviewing (MI) is a person-centered, goal-oriented, guiding method to enhance motivation to change. This evidence-based approach is relevant for care providers of all disciplines in health care, behavioral health and social service settings. In this two-day workshop designed for participants new or relatively new to MI, learn about the spirit, core skills, processes, and applications of MI. The workshop will be highly interactive with opportunities for practice and feedback.

Research Opportunity
