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David Marcovitz, MD, is an addiction psychiatrist at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. He serves as the medical director of the Vanderbilt Addiction Consult Team and teaches on various addiction-related topics to medical students, residents, fellows, and colleagues. He is also Tennessee's senior trainer supporting the State Targeted Response–Technical Assistance (STR–TA) grant to help build addiction treatment capacity across Tennessee. His primary passions include providing high-quality addiction care, developing models of collaborative care with other medical specialties, and medical education.

Dr. Marcovitz completed an addiction psychiatry fellowship at Partners Healthcare / Harvard Medical School and has worked in both academic and private, as well as inpatient and outpatient, addiction treatment facilities. He became waivered to prescribe buprenorphine in 2014. He has accrued significant experience treating patients with substance use disorders with medication-assisted treatment, including experience with prescribing buprenorphine/naloxone, intramuscular naltrexone, and methadone (at a dedicated methadone maintenance program). He also has experience working in team-based inpatient and outpatient clinical settings, including close work with non-psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, recovery coaches, and other staff.
